6. Substandard Furnishing and teaching Equipment
7. Poor Space Utilization

1. Brick replacements and re-pointing
2. Replacement with updated equipment
3. New double-pane, energy-efficient windows
4. Professionally remove and abate
5. Upgrade to current codes and standards
6. Upgrade and replace
7. Add classrooms; improve and reconfigure space
