FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

### *How Great Is Our God* Sermon Series Begins

**DURING MY SOPHOMORE YEAR** of college I was privileged to go to Kenya. There, in the Great Rift Valley, I saw the most amazing display of stars. I still remember

staring and thanking God for His beauty on display.

The words that still resonate with me are the words of David in Psalm 8:1, “**O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is Your Name in all the earth! You have set Your glory above the heavens.**” I still don’t know how people can look at creation and not think there is a Creator. And not just a Creator, a great and loving God!

When David looked at the stars and all of creation, a question came to his mind. In some ways, his question is similar to the question that God asked the Israelites through Isaiah in 40:25-26 when He said, “**To whom then will you compare Me, that I should be like him? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: who created these? He who brings out their host by number, calling them all by name, by the greatness of His might, and because He is strong in power not one is missing.**” God is saying through creation—*I am great; no one can compare to Me.*

The question that David had was similar and went something like, “God is so amazing and so great, why would He even care about me? I am so small in comparison to all of the greatness

of God that is on display.” David’s words are more beautiful, poetic, and to the point in Psalm 8:3-4: “**When I look at Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars,**

**which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?”**

It’s true. When I was in Kenya and I looked at all the stars in the heavens and realized the greatness of God, I was truly humbled. I felt very small.

You know, as I think about that last sentence I wrote, I think to myself, what’s wrong with being overwhelmed by God’s greatness? Nothing. We should feel humbled. We should feel small. God is greater than we can ever imagine.

Yet, how often do we put God in a box that we can carry around and not allow Him to engage every aspect of our life? How often do we limit His abilities by not trusting in Him? How often do we look for sources of motivation and encouragement other than God?

I don’t know about you, but I want to be truly overwhelmed. I want to feel small. I want the greatness of God to enlarge my

vision. I want God’s greatness to push me to follow Him.

I don’t want a small God, I want the great God that He is.

How about you?

May God bless you with His wonderful Presence,

## Beauty for Ashes

**IN A TIME OF PAIN** and confusion, we were blessed over and over again by our First Church family. Prayer, phone calls, visits, food and clothing all carried us when we lost our home to a disastrous fire on the morning of December 31, 2008.

The love of God that was poured out on us during the days following the fire will live with us forever. Even before the fire trucks arrived that snowy morning, our next-door neighbor was at our side. At the firemen's request, she whisked us away to her home. She and her husband took us wherever we needed to go, and, with another couple, helped us find temporary housing. They truly made us part of their home life. They welcomed whoever appeared at their doorstep during our twelve-day stay with them. They were truly in awe of the love and caring showed by our church family. In fact, this led to her joining the next *Alpha* class and attending First Church services.

It is difficult to find words to express our gratitude to our beautiful church family for all that has been done for us. Their delicious

food nourished us, calls and visits encouraged and counseled us, clothing kept us warm. But, most of all, the many prayers sustained us. Many even cried with us.

How can we ever thank our precious church family except to thank God for them? This has truly been a living demonstration of Christian stewardship and love in its finest form.

### INTERVIEW

*In a subsequent discussion with a member of the Stewardship Team, Bruce and Betty specifically mentioned a First Church couple who came with bundles of clothes they had gathered, put their arms around them, and cried and prayed with them. They spoke of those who spent hours with the firemen, helping to retrieve valuables and papers that were not destroyed, and those who gave the Woodwards transportation (they are severely vision-impaired). And they described how the plea from Caring Ministries resulted in an unforgettable outpouring of love, concern, and true Christian stewardship from countless others.*

## Church School Kickoff



**Parents!** The new Church School year starts on **Sunday, September 12**, at 9:15 and 11:00 a.m. Classes are offered for children from age 3 through Grade 6. The **Crib Room** is staffed during both services with loving caregivers for infants up to 18 months. The **Toddler Room** is where two-year-olds enjoy playing, praying, and learning simple Bible truths.

If you have not registered your child in a previous year, stop by the Children's Ministries info table in the Wells Area on that day to complete a form. A listing of classroom locations will be available. For those with changes from last year, teachers will provide forms in the classrooms.

### This Ministry Needs Called Workers!

There are several areas still available to serve children directly or in supportive roles. **Beginning September 12** and continuing through the school year, time commitments range from weekly to monthly, or "as needed" for special events or projects. **Come! Serve with a team that enjoys growing together as we serve our children and families.** Here are just some of the many opportunities for service in this life-changing ministry:

- **Church School** — Work with a specific age group, from age 3 through Grade 6.
- **Wednesday evenings** — Work two hours with boys and girls in Grades 1 through 5.
- **Crib Room or Toddler Room** — Work one Sunday a month.
- **Substitute helper** — Work once a month in a classroom or childcare area.
- **Childcare** — Once weekly or monthly.

## Programs for Children

**THE CRIB AND TODDLER ROOMS** are staffed with loving caregivers during the 9:15 and 11:00 a.m. worship services.

**CHURCH SCHOOL** classes are offered at 9:15 and 11:00 on Sunday mornings for children age 3 through Grade 6.

■ **On Family Sundays**, children (grades 1–6) attending the 9:15 and 11:00 classes will go directly to the worship service with their parents and be dismissed to a large-group program following the Children's Time. The first Family Sunday is **September 26**.

## FAST (Fifth And Sixth Together)

**Children in grades 5 and 6** (and sometimes their families), along with their Church School teachers, come together at least once a month outside of the classroom to serve, play or study together as a group. 




