FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

IN PSALM 24, David asks a question that is for all mankind: *Who can stand in God's Presence? Who can ascend the holy hill and stand before God?* David

knows that God is not a mere mortal but is the Almighty Creator of the Universe, who owns everything. So, who can stand in His Presence? Who is worthy to worship Him?

David's answer might surprise you. Although everybody may worship Him, not everyone will receive God's blessings. Who is the one who will receive God's blessings and be considered righteous in His eyes (verse 5)? David states that it is those who love others, those who treat others with fairness (clean hands) and with pure motives (pure heart).

By the sound of it, David seems to be espousing a relationship with God based on works. That is where verse 6 comes in. David tells us that the people who live in proper

relationship with others are those who seek the face of God. **Seeking the face of God means being in deep, intimate relationship with Him.** Often when we read in the Old Testament the phrase "in His Presence," it literally means "before His face." So we seek God's face by being in His Presence.

Moses' relationship with God sums it up well, in Exodus 33:11: "Thus the LORD used to speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend."

Getting back to the psalm, David is telling us that the fruit or outcome of seeking God's Presence will be seen in how we treat those around us. Our relationship with God

is connected to our relationship with others.

We are in the season of Lent, the season when we strive to walk close to Jesus as He heads to the Cross. *This Lent, instead of focusing on what we can give up, let's focus on going deeper with God.* Let's seek His face. Let's spend more time in His Presence.

And, as we seek His face, let's long for Jesus, our King, to enter into our lives, our church, and our community (verses 7-10).

Here at First Church, we want to continue moving forward with our mission of being a *community of Jesus followers who love God, love one another, and make disciples.*

Our first priority as disciples is to grow in our relationship with God. We are to be a people who *seek God's face.*

What does seeking His face look like? In short, it means being in His Presence. It's reading His

Word, spending time with Him in prayer, worshiping Him with His people.

During this season of Lent, we are given the opportunity to seek His face. Use this period to *ignite your relationship with Him.*

David tells us in Psalm 27:8 that God is calling us to seek His face. Let us respond together with David,
Your face, Lord, I will seek.

LENTEN SERMONS (listed at right) focus on helping us, through selected Psalms, to draw closer to God—through Lent and beyond. The sermons also may be heard starting the same afternoon at www.firstchurch.org.

MIDWEEK LENTEN SERVICES are centered on the theme of seeking God's face, continuing **through April 13**, from 6:30 to 7:10 p.m. **each Wednesday.** They are another opportunity to draw closer to God—through worship, fellowship, Bible teaching, prayer, and Holy Communion. For those who wish to remain until 8:00 p.m., we are further exploring that evening's topic and practicing something of what we learned.

QUIET DAY—**Saturday, April 9**, will be a day set aside for us to get away from all the noise and distractions of everyday life and to have a focused time of listening to God. There will be guided periods in the Meetinghouse for seeking God together, and times for finding other spaces at the church for smaller groups, personal prayer, and other suggested approaches. *Watch for more information.*

Seder Dinner

Come and celebrate an incredible Seder experience with your family of faith on **Friday, April 15**. The Seder is a Jewish ritual feast that marks the beginning of Passover (our dinner is a few days earlier). The focal point is a retelling of how the Lord set the Israelites free from slavery in Egypt. Jesus celebrated the Seder. More importantly, many of the symbols used in this festival are especially profound in light of Good Friday and Easter, only a few days away.

Rabbi Paul L. Saal (photo), Vice President of the Messianic Jewish Rabbinical Council and faculty member of the Messianic Jewish Theological Institute, will lead us in this traditional Passover Seder, a sacred drama that points to Jesus’ own provision for salvation. Experience what it truly means to be “Abraham’s Seed” (Galatians 3:29). And have a few laughs in the process!



This part of our program, which includes the traditional Seder plate and a teaching on the significance of each symbol, begins promptly at 6:15.

A mouth-watering lamb dinner and dessert, prepared by our talented **Judy Carson**, follows at 7:15. The evening ends at 9:00. For practical reasons, those attending are respectfully asked to come to both parts of the evening.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me more than these?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Feed My lambs." He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" He said to Him, "Yes, Lord; You know that I love You." He said to him, "Tend My sheep." He said to Him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love Me?" and

he said to Him, "Lord, You know everything; You know that I love You." Jesus said to him, "Feed My sheep. Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go." (This He said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this He said to him, "Follow Me."

—John 21:15-19 (ESV)

Jesus believes in us. He has entrusted us with the work of His Kingdom. And He has promised to lead us into that work. Will you follow Him?

EMPOWERMENT

Jesus loved Peter. There are so many examples in which He demonstrates His love for Peter that I don't have room to list them all. In my opinion, the encounter in John 21, which takes place after Jesus' death and resurrection, is one of the most profound demonstrations of Jesus' love for him.

It is a beautiful conversation. It is so different from the conversations we encounter in our world today. Despite the pain Jesus must have felt from Peter's earlier denial, His response to Peter after His resurrection is so contrary to the culture in which we live.

Have you ever wondered what Peter thought about himself between the hour when he denied Jesus and this moment when he stands face to face with his resurrected Savior? I think there were significant feelings of guilt and shame residing within him. He must have felt worthless and without purpose.

Jesus' solution to the condition of Peter's heart is empowerment. In a way that is almost poetic, Jesus asks Peter three questions, one to parallel each of Peter's three denials. After sharing a meal together (have you ever noticed how frequently Jesus' ministry takes place around a table?), Jesus turns to His disciple and asks him, "Do you love Me?" "Yes" is Peter's response. "Feed My lambs," Jesus tells him. Two more times Jesus and Peter have this interchange. And finally Jesus leaves him with the words, "Follow Me."

Jesus' way of discipleship revolved around empowerment. He never allowed His disciples the opportunity to be passive participants in the work of the Kingdom. Why is empowerment the method He chose? Empowerment communicates a message of worth and value. When we

feel worth and value we feel motivated to move forward.

A fellow pastor once raised a unique and powerful point drawn from the story of Jesus walking on the water toward His dis-



ciples. As he reflected on Jesus' question to Peter, "Why did you doubt?", his conclusion wasn't that Peter doubted Jesus but that *Peter doubted that he could become more like his rabbi Jesus.*

Jesus came to empower you and me to live as His disciples. Mark 6:7-13 illustrates perfectly just how much Jesus believed in those He invested Himself in. After the disciples had been with Him for some time,

Jesus sends them out to do what they have been watching Him do.

My favorite part is in Mark 6:30-31. After the disciples return, Jesus says to them, "Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest a while." This is the other side of empowerment. Empowerment involves both entrusting others with responsibility and creating a space where those who are sent out can return to unpack or process what they've experienced.

Empowerment is also at the core of what it means to be the Church. We have all received salvation so that we might all live as active ambassadors of Jesus' message of reconciliation. We do this by living a **missional and incarnational life** within our immediate contexts.

Missional means that we are passionate about communicating the Gospel and seeing the Kingdom of God advance.

Incarnational means that we communicate this in a way that others can receive. *We do so by being aware of where others are at, engaging relationally with depth and authenticity, and empowering them to move along the road of discipleship.*

Jesus was missional and incarnational with Peter. In John 21, Jesus presents Peter, yet again, with the grace of the Gospel (missional) and does it in a way that meets Peter's specific needs at the time (incarnational). This is the posture required of us if we are to be disciples who empower others to become disciples.

Jesus believes in us. He has entrusted us with the work of His Kingdom. And He has promised to lead us into that work. Will you follow Him?

Giving to the Kingdom of God

FIFTH IN A SERIES ON FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

Everyone has time and money for the things they put first. Our calendars and checkbooks mirror our priorities.

This is the article that most of you have been waiting for. *Should I give to the church? And if so, how much?*

Why should I give to the Church?

Because God tells us to. Leviticus 27:30-33 is where the principle of giving the first 10% of one’s income (called a tithe) to God’s Church is defined. This is so important to God that if you will honor it, He makes a promise to you in Malachi 3:10-12 (NIV):

“Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house. Test Me in this,” says the LORD Almighty, “and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it. I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe,” says the LORD Almighty. “Then all the nations will call you blessed, for yours will be a delightful land,” says the LORD Almighty.”

This is one of the few places in Scripture where God challenges you to test Him, and we should take it *very* seriously.

Why should I give to First Church?

Because Jesus expects us to. Like every other Jew of His time, Jesus would have given to His synagogue. This is apparent in what Jesus said to the Pharisees in Matthew 23:23—He criticized them for giving only a tithe while ignoring the more important matters of faithfulness, mercy, and justice, saying *“You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former.”* Jesus’ expectation was to tithe where we worship.

What else does the New Testament say about this?

But most references to tithing are in the Old Testament, some say. As seen above in Matthew 23, Jesus expected Jews to be obedient to the Old Testament concept of tithing. *But aren’t we*

under a new covenant now? Do the old principles still apply? Let’s look at this a little closer. I think this is the key verse:

“Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”

—2 Corinthians 9:6-7 (NIV)

Do you remember the last financial stewardship article, which was on the importance of generosity to our Lord? Generosity is the big point. Generosity adds grace and mercy to obedient giving that allows us to avoid becoming legalistic.

I believe the New Testament standard of giving is higher than tithing. Tithing is just the beginning. If generosity is the standard, and cheerful giving is in the Word, then tithing alone doesn’t really represent the heart for giving and sharing that God is looking for.

Conclusion

God did not command us to give because He needs the money. God commands us to give because it improves each giver.

When we look at all of Scripture, it is obvious that giving, whether tithing alone or (beyond that) giving generously, is very important to God.

Basic truth: We have to let go of what we have in our hand before we can receive anything else.

We can’t receive the full, abundant life that Jesus talks about throughout the Bible if we are hanging on to money. We should release some of God’s abundant monetary blessing back into His Kingdom so it can be a blessing to others.

And Jesus expects us to give to the Kingdom through the church where we worship.
