TWO WEEKS AGO, Wayne and Tessa and I went to hear Ken Boa speak at a session for pastors with Vision New England. Ken's insight into the spiritual life was excellent, as it was for us at First Church the whole weekend.

The best part for me about the time with VNE was the ride home. We discussed what we heard from Ken Boa. We shared our hopes and dreams for our own spiritual lives and for the church. We even confessed our struggles and pledged together to pray for one another.

None of us wanted to leave that afternoon without a commitment to go deeper in our

relationship with God. Ken pleaded with us to memorize four prayers that Paul prayed, and he asked us to use them to pray for others in the church. We enthusiastically determined to do that, and even now I am looking at my flash card of the first prayer in Ephesians. I am not only memorizing it but I am also turning it into a prayer for myself and others.

I want to invite you to join us in this commitment. The prayers are found in **Ephesians 1:17-19a**, **Ephesians 3:16-19**, **Philippians 1:9-11**, and **Colossians 1:9b-12**. I will spend time over the next month going over these prayers in my blog [www.pastorderyk.blogspot.com]. I ask that you pray these prayers for our church. Paul prayed them for churches back then—and they are just as important now.

Also take the step of memorizing them, one at a time. I believe God will be faithful in bringing these prayers to our minds when we need them.

Throughout history, God has been pleased to stir up His people with fresh moves of His Holy Spirit. I believe He is beginning to do it again. He always begins these movements by calling His people to pray. I think this is our opportunity to begin to pray, daring to believe that He will move again.


COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DINNER AT NOON

Hymns will be selected from suggestions (*one per person*) submitted by *November 6* to the music office, to music@firstchurch.org,




or to 860.529.1575, ext. 209; and from those in attendance at the concert, time permitting.
