We delivered **373 filled boxes** to the regional distribution center in Bloomfield. Pray that God will meet the physical and spiritual needs of the hurting or impoverished children who receive these gifts.

New Sunday Service Times

Starting Sunday, February 5, First Church will offer two traditional services instead of three. These two services will be at 8:45 and 10:30 a.m. Also, the Wind service time will change to 10:30 a.m. to correspond with the second traditional service.

The new times were determined by the Board of Deacons, who took into account average attendance at each service, input provided by the congregation in December at an informal meeting, and the results of a congregational survey about our services. Also considered was the length of time needed between services by the Ministry of Music, for Wells Area fellowship, and to ease parking congestion.

In the survey, the congregation responded overwhelmingly favorably to moving from four to three services—two traditional and one contemporary—affirming that merging the three traditional services into two will serve to enhance our worship experience by having each traditional service fuller.

The Deacons realize that the change in service times will be a difficult adjustment for some, and trust and pray that the new schedule will be a positive change in the life of our beloved Church.
