



## Edwards Forum with Robert Sirico

WE ARE EXCITED to host **Rev. Robert Sirico**, president of the Acton Institute, in the Meetinghouse on the evenings of Friday and Saturday, **October 12 and 13**, as part of our **Jonathan Edwards Forum** series. The Acton Institute is an international organization cofounded by Fr. Sirico “for the study of religion and liberty” and is based in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Fr. Sirico will speak on two topics, one each evening at 7:00 p.m. His first talk, on October

12, will be on the foundations of political and economic freedom; and in his second talk, October 13, he will focus on dealing with poverty. Fr. Sirico is widely respected and published, as well as prominent in national media. ### Treasure

**THE OTHER DAY** I received a letter in the mail. In the letter was a credit card and I was told I had a credit line of 10,000 dollars. They then counted all the ways I could spend it.

All of us have been given those offers. We have all felt the pull of a culture that calls us to spend, spend, spend. We are bombarded with messages about how we are to use our money, or how to take on debt, or how we are to invest.

The question that I think is important for us is—what does the Bible say about these subjects? Most of us know what the Bible says about giving. What does it say about debt and savings? How are we to view credit cards? Do these things connect at all with being disciples?

This October’s brief preaching series, entitled **Treasure**, will look at the practical ways we are to use money.

### Yoke

**ON WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 9** [originally scheduled for October 10], I will begin a new series entitled **Yoke**, looking at how we are to be disciples. *Yoke* was the teaching of a rabbi. When Jesus said to us that He wants us to take on His yoke, He was referring to His understanding of how we are to live.

This series will be different than other series I have taught. We will use the Gospel of Mark to ask ourselves some questions: *How did Jesus make disciples? What did He model to His disciples? How did He live out His mission?*

My hope is that through this guided discussion all of us will be transformed to look like Jesus and live in His Kingdom.

## About the Rev. Robert A. Sirico

As president of the Acton Institute, Robert A. Sirico speaks widely at colleges, universities and business organizations. His writings on religious, political, economic, and social matters are published in the *New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, *Forbes*, the *London Financial Times*, the *Washington Times*, *National Review*, and others.

Father Sirico is frequently called upon by members of the broadcast media for statements regarding economics, civil

rights, and a variety of issues of religious concern, and has provided insightful commentary for CNN, ABC, the BBC, National Public Radio, and CBS's *60 Minutes*, among others.

In 1999, Fr. Sirico was awarded an honorary doctorate in Christian Ethics from the Franciscan University of Steubenville, and in 2001, Universidad Francisco Marroquin awarded him an honorary doctorate in Social Sciences.

Fr. Sirico's pastoral ministry has included a chaplaincy to AIDS patients at the National Institutes of Health and the recent founding of a new community, St. Philip Neri House in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

The Acton Institute maintains a vigorous editorial outreach, especially through Fr. Sirico. The Acton website—[acton.org](http://acton.org)—has an archive of many of his essays and reviews.

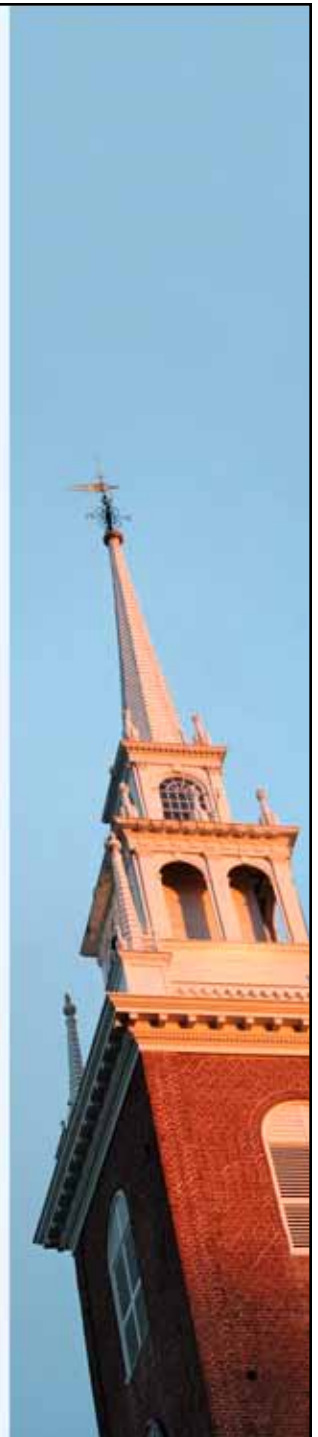

**KIDS SERVING KIDS** — The mission project for this year's Vacation Bible Camp participants was for the children to bring their pennies, nickels, dimes, etc., to be used for purchasing needed mosquito nets for at-risk children living in Mali, a country in Western Africa. Malaria is a deadly mosquito-borne disease,

and we learned that every 30 seconds a child dies from malaria. Our children's hearts were deeply moved! A total of \$693.89 was brought in during the five days of VBC (held July 23-27) which will purchase 115 nets. The children also wrote **friendship cards** to send to the children who receive the mosquito nets.
