

Moving from Church Board to Elder Board



AFTER MUCH PRAYER, thought and discussion, the leadership of First Church—Church Board, Deacons, and the pastoral staff—recommends that we return to the original **elder** model of organization from our current **corporate** model.

This article is the first in a series that will introduce the congregation to this important change in church structure and governance. Of course, any change will require a vote and congregational approval.

What is an elder?

“Elder” is the biblical term given to a leader/shepherd/overseer in a church, and the Bible sets a very high standard for this position. Scripture clearly defines the character and gifting required for an elder:

- Must be a shepherd; cares for and protects the flock.

—Acts 20:17-18, 28-31; 1 Peter 5:1-4

YOU NOTICE from the headline above that the Board is recommending that we return to having an Elder Board. I enthusiastically support this.



The congregational church I grew up in has an Elder Board that leads the church. The congregation still makes congregational decisions. It still has annual meetings. Yet it recognizes those in the church with the gift of shepherd leadership and empowers them to lead the church to God’s preferred future.

I would like to share with you some of the reasons that I support this shift.

First, let me begin by saying that our current Church Board is doing great work. I love working with them, and we are striving together to lead us moving forward. That being said, all of us on the Board believe it is best to return to an Elder Board model.

The greatest reason for returning is that it is a biblical model. The above article shares many of the Scriptures that support this. The early Church, under the twelve disciples, had an elder model of leadership, not a corporate one.

The size of our church also contributes to the need for making this shift. As churches get larger, their governance changes. In a church our size, the Board needs to spend less time communicating what is going on with the different boards and committees and be more future-focused while providing direction and leadership. Our present Church Board has already begun to make this shift, but there is more work to do.

Finally, if we are going to ask the Board to provide more leadership, we need to find the right people with the right gifting to lead us. God has already gifted people in this congregation with the spiritual gift and experience of leadership. My desire is to see them all at the table together listening to God, discerning His direction and helping us get there.

An elder is someone who is called and gifted by God to shepherd His flock by providing spiritual care and leadership. Don’t we want all of those people in the same room leading us? I firmly believe that if we make this decision, God will richly bless us.
