I'm sure this Advent will be like no other. They will be able to relate to the story of Mary and Joseph in a new way. They will understand in part how Mary and Joseph were

feeling when Jesus kicked inside the womb.

We might not see it yet. But just like a baby, God's gift is growing. Eventually, we will see His wonderful gift.

In the meantime, how should we respond to God's unexpected gifts?

Just like a couple waiting for a child to be born—with joy and holy anticipation.

The Outreach Gift Shop, founded 30 years ago by Meg Barstow and Ruth Truex, has partnered with nonprofit, fair trade organizations like SERRV International and Ten Thousand Villages to reduce poverty through connections with low-income artisans and farmers around the world, helping those in third-world countries to develop and market their products. Also, for all ages, there is a lot to learn here about other cultures!

Your purchases provide opportunity, training, support and a fair income to these men and women—including some new projects:

We continue to sell note cards with photos of children and families taken on our mission trips to the Dominican Republic, to benefit the Feed-A-Family food program. Team members have hand-delivered parcels of food that feed households for up to a month.

We are also selling lovely necklaces hand-made by women from the D. R. batays with

the proceeds going directly to the individuals who make them. And most recently we are selling boxed greeting cards to help support Heydy, the Compassion International child sponsored by our Church School children.
