

Outreach Mission Festival Nears!

FREE EVENING BANQUET, MARCH 9 • MISSION PREACHER AND FREE LUNCHEON, MARCH 10

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.”

The Church has one mission—the Great Commission (above). In keeping with Jesus’ command, our Outreach Team has chosen **A Heart for the Harvest** as this year’s theme. **Pastor Lubin Beaucejour** (shown at right) of Bethesda Evangelical Mission will be our keynote speaker on **Mission Sunday, March 10**, including the sermon at all services. Many members of First Church are familiar with Pastor Lubin, with whom we partner for our Dominican Republic and Haiti mission trips.

All are invited to the **Saturday evening Mission Banquet** in Keith Jones Hall, at 5:30 on **March 9**, and the **Sunday Luncheon** in the Fireside Room, at 12:30 on **March 10**.

THE BANQUET NIGHT will feature the **Wibberleys**, who will be returning to their country of service the next day. The **D.R. and Haiti teams** will present their vision for this summer; we will have updates from our mission interns, **Sarah Papertsian** and **Ryan Burke**, in person or by video; the **Peru team** will share via video during their mission trip; **Hartford City Mission** and **InterVarsity Hartford** will be with us; plus a **youth trip presentation by Pastor Todd**—and much more. This is a wonderful opportunity to see and hear what God is doing internationally and locally and to become engaged in the Harvest field.

THE SUNDAY LUNCHEON will continue the momentum from Saturday night and the Sunday services, featuring a time with Pastor Lubin and First Church teams going into the Harvest field this year (spring, summer, fall, winter).

Mission participants’ booths will be in the Wells Fellowship Area all weekend, and the flags of the nations representing the Harvest we participate in will be displayed. Please pray that the Harvest of souls will be plentiful for our great God and King—Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Changing Lives through HCM

HARTFORD CITY MISSION (HCM) is a dynamic, multi-faceted ministry working in the midst of Hartford's North End neighborhood, founded by First Church in partnership with other churches. We remain deeply involved.

Over the years, HCM has gone through many changes as its staff and volunteers have sought even better ways to be an effective presence for the Kingdom of God in Hartford. **In the next few issues of *The Spire*, I'd like to share this vibrant Kingdom community with you.**

I'd like to give you one of my favorite glimpses into the ministry of HCM.

Every Thursday, a contingent of high school students accompanies me to the North End to work with HCM's **Noah After School** program, where elementary school students receive both academic and spiritual mentoring. First Church's **Shane Sullivan** (*see photo*), a sophomore at Wethersfield High School, has been one of our mentoring volunteers for over a year now.

Shane has a passion to walk alongside those with fewer resources and opportunities. I have observed that his long-term, hands-on involvement has led to some amazing benefits:



(1) Shane understands what it means to be a disciple-maker, and his relationship with Jesus has deepened.

(2) Shane has seen, first-hand, that God cares about the whole person: their studies, their spiritual formation, their emotional and physical health—and how He uses Shane and others to change the lives of those in need.

(3) Shane's personal character and his passion to help others have strengthened and grown.

Our other young mentors have shown similar growth and have seen lives changed!

I look forward to sharing more with you about this vital ministry our church is so blessed to be a part of. God spoke these words through His prophet Jeremiah:

“Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.” —Jeremiah 29:7

As God continues to teach us more about His charge to make disciples of all

nations, may we not turn a blind eye to our own city. Like Shane and others, may we choose to invest in the lives of our neighbors—even at the expense of our own lives and comforts.
