Caring Ministries Update

When Cathy and I first began attending First Church over five years ago, we were deeply impressed by the many ways the church demonstrates its love for one another in caring for its members. As our congregation continues to embrace the mission of the church by loving God and loving each other, *care* will continue to be one of our core values.

In meeting the needs of our congregation, Caring Ministries has been undergoing a shift away from a *centralized* ministry to a *congregational* ministry, with members caring for one another. This does not mean we will do away with Caring Ministries. it simply means that the focus of this ministry will adapt to best meet the needs.

My role as Director of Caring Ministries will continue, even as I take on a broader responsibility in the area of Community Development, in which my responsibility will be to help *oversee and ensure that all ministries fit together and align with our church's vision.* I see this new mix of responsibilities as an opportunity to help develop the care ministry more fully within the congregation, creating a broader caring community.

I also believe that with the existing training classes and more

under development, we will be able to equip new members of the congregation to add to our dedicated Pastoral Care, Stephen Ministry, and Visitation teams. We are also developing a new community night with Life Groups, geared to-



ward support and offering a place of connection for those experiencing the many pressures of modern daily living.

Along with the shift in my role, there has been a shift taking place in the role of the Caring Ministries Administrative Assistant. This position has, over the years, grown from merely an administrative role to a position of a ministry partner, who is capable of taking on the role of Care Coordinator for the congregation.

It is my joy to serve God at First Church while serving with you all. I continue to believe God is doing great things in our midst and that we will continue to witness an ever-increasing impact of God's activities among us.

Annual Financial Meeting Called for June 9; Informational Meeting Set for May 29

The congregation will vote on the proposed 2013/14 budget at the annual **Financial Meeting** of First Church of Christ, called for **Sunday**, **June 9**, following the 10:30 a.m. services, in the Meetinghouse. All church members are urged to attend.

The agenda will include a discussion of the proposed budget and any other appropriate financial matters of the church. Printed copies will be available at the church in advance. In addition, all are invited to an informational meeting on **Wednesday, May 29**, from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m., in Conference Room 1 (behind Reception).

Enhancements in the Nursery School Wing

The Church Board is directing that security enhancements be made to the first floor of the Cadwell Building to provide safer surroundings for the children attending the Nursery School.

Already we have made some minor modifications to existing doors but will soon be adding swipe card access and an additional set of doors to keep the area secure while allowing members and guests to use the elevator during school hours. Installation of security cameras in the entries, corridor, playground and all three classrooms will provide immediate views (and a recorded history) of actions in these areas, which can be accessed by the receptionist, selected staff and the Wethersfield Police Department.

The work on structures, policies and training of personnel will be ongoing in cooperation with the Nursery School, Board representatives, the Property Division and the Safety and Security Committee, and are a direct result of the tragic event in Newtown last December. It is our hope these steps will, to the best of our ability, make the school less vulnerable to possible acts of violence and maintain a higher level of response to other issues that could occur on the campus.

Going Deeper with HCM

IT HAS MEANT SO MUCH TO ME to share about the ministry of **Hartford City Mission** (HCM) in the last few *Spire* issues.

My own Hartford ministry journey began in 1995. That was when I, along with many of you, began traveling down to the Charter Oak Terrace housing projects on Saturday mornings to work with the LIFE program. God planted a seed during my time spent with that ministry.

I can remember—as a 15-year-old new follower of Jesus—walking door to door with Ed Kenyon and Grace Morgan. They were two of the many who taught me what it means to *love like Jesus*.

Several years later I found myself in Hartford again, this time serving as the summer intern for what was then Noah's Sidewalk Sonday School (HCM had not yet been created). I would spend my afternoons walking the neighborhoods, at times alone, visiting the families who lived there. These were some of the formative years that led me to enter into full-time ministry.

I wish I had time to tell you all the stories. In this issue I want to share a bit about the *heart* of the ministry of HCM. Words have limitations, so my challenge to you is this: *If God has been stirring your heart as you've been reading about the great work happening in Hartford, take the plunge and enter into the story yourself.*

The best word to describe the ministry of HCM is *committed*. The philosophy of HCM expresses a deep commitment to the community it is investing in. The staff, board members, and volunteers are committed to the work they are doing, and as a result, many of them have chosen to move into the neighborhood.

They've shifted from viewing ministry as an *event* to seeing ministry as a *way of life*. Those who have made this decision will tell you that they are motivated by the simple desire to become more like Jesus.

God's decision to enter into our lives through the incarnation of Jesus is the activity underlying what many refer to as *incar-*

national ministry, which means entering into the world of those we are seeking to reach with the Gospel. It involves caring about every part of their lives.

Jesus spent thirty years living among the people of Israel before his official ministry began. What was He doing during that time? We don't know for sure, but I think this much is true: God was deeply identifying Himself with His people. He had experienced first-hand many of the aspects of their lives. I see this same idea underlying our own vision here at First Church. We have a desire to see more people come to know Jesus, to see His Kingdom expand.

We're beginning to recognize the importance of developing deep relationships with God, with one another, and with those to whom we are imparting the message of Jesus. We're also learning that sharing the Gospel is about so much more than sharing words—it means sharing our lives as well.

This idea permeates the Apostle Paul's words in 1 Thessalonians 2:8, "Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the Gospel of God but our lives as well."

I pray that we as a church would develop an even deeper love for the people of Hartford and the communities we live in, so that Paul's words might become our own.

Joseph Russell, who took first place in the High School Division, is from Grayslake, Illinois and just completed his senior year at the Interlochen Arts Academy. In 2012, Joe was awarded the Fine Arts award, one of the most prestigious awards given to students at Interlochen. He plans to pursue a degree in organ performance and sacred music.

Michael Gebhart, first-place winner in the Young Professional Division, has completed his second year as an undergraduate organ performance major at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where he studies with Dr. Janette Fishell. He is Organ Scholar at Christ Church (Episcopal) Cathedral, Indianapolis. From 2008 to 2009, he worked full-time as music director at Blessed Sacrament Church in Providence, Rhode Island.

These young virtuosi will offer works by
